QUESTION

To promote public education, student and teacher safety, and academic performance, shall The School District of Kansas City 33 (d/b/a Kansas City Public Schools) issue its general obligation bonds in the amount of \$474,000,000, for constructing, repairing, improving, and equipping new and aging public school buildings, including safety and security measures, heating and cooling systems, roofs, plumbing, and other deferred maintenance?

If this question is approved, the District will levy a debt service property tax in the estimated amount of \$0.6100 per one hundred dollars of assessed valuation of real and personal property, with \$50,000,000 of the total \$474,000,000 amount of general obligation bonds allocated for nine participating public charter schools.

Shall Reorganized School District No. 7 of Jackson County, Missouri (Lee's Summit R-7) issue its general obligation bonds in the amount of \$225,000,000, estimated to result in no increase to the District's debt service property tax levy, for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, improving, repairing, renovating, furnishing and equipping new and existing school sites and facilities and the purchase of land?

If this question is approved, the District's debt service property tax levy is estimated to remain unchanged at \$0.87 per \$100 of assessed valuation of real and personal property.

QUESTION 1

Capital Improvements Sales Tax – Public Safety

Shall the City of Kansas City continue to impose a sales tax authorized by Section 94.577 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri for a period of 20 years at a rate of 1/4% to be used for police, emergency medical services and emergency management associated with administering public safety within Kansas City, including the construction, operation, and maintenance of capital improvements, which may include the retirement of debt under previously authorized indebtedness or to repay bonds not yet issued?

This sales tax would continue the existing sales tax authorized by Section 94.577 of the Revised Statutes of Missouri and scheduled to expire on June 30, 2026.
